



## CONFLICT MINERALS POLICY

VICENTE TORNS, a company committed to sustainable development, with a proactive and reactive attitude, in the current framework and context of the problem in times of the SDG sustainable development goals, applies this Policy on conflict minerals to all companies affiliated with VICENTE TORNS to all employees and supply chain and all must cooperate in accordance with this Policy.

Vicente Torns is committed to the Responsible Minerals Regulation with regard to so-called "Conflict Minerals" (cassiterite, "coltan", wolframite and its derivatives, tin tantalum, niobium, tungsten and gold, known as 3TG), from the Democratic Republic of the Congo "DRC", and the countries covered (Central African Republic, South Sudan, Uganda, Rwanda, Burundi, Tanzania, Zambia and Angola) and all high-risk conflict-affected areas included in the CAHRA list.

Vicente Torns has implemented a policy of responsibility and mandatory compliance in the mineral supply program designed in accordance with international standards based on Regulation (EU) 2017/821 and Delegated Regulation (EU) 2019/429 with which it is completed and OECD due diligence guide.

VICENTE TORNS is committed to:

- ✓ Do not contribute to the illegal exploitation of minerals to break the link between conflicts and be able to guarantee peace and development.
- ✓ Reject the violation of human rights, child labor, sexual violence, the destruction of enclaves creating forced resettlements,
- ✓ "Protect, Respect and Remedy" according to the "Guiding Principles on Business and Human Rights".
- ✓ Carry out an annual questionnaire to suppliers, evaluating in particular that they meet the sustainable sourcing requirement and have fully integrated social, ethical and environmental practices.
- ✓ Request declarations from all suppliers annually (CFSI-CMRT), to ensure that the copper they supply us does not intentionally or maliciously contain any of these elements.
- ✓ Request all suppliers for their "Conflict Minerals" policies.
- ✓ Do not collaborate with any company, person or entity that gives or demands any type of bribery or corruption.
